

## Audio Transcript of João Alvares Fagundes (of Viana, Portugal; for Portugal) 1519 to 1526

**Audio Transcript:** In 1519 Fagundes was given the right to explore the coast south and west of the grant given to the Corte-Real family in 1506 (eastern Newfoundland). By 1520 he had reached Cape Breton Island where he may have established a small settlement. After a year the settlement was abandoned due to poor climatic conditions and deteriorating Aboriginal relations. Exploration shifted south along the Nova Scotia coast to the Bay of Fundy where a second settlement may have been briefly erected.
