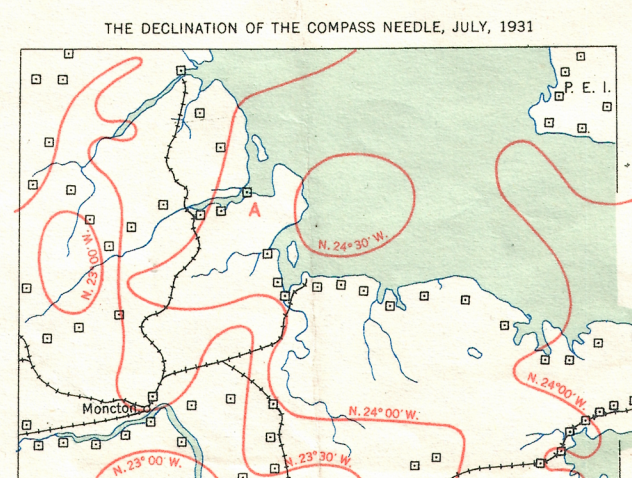

NOTE: The grid squares provide a ready method of referring to or locating features. They are four miles by side and subdivided into quarters by dotted lines. The east and west sides of the squares are not true north and south lines, but have a deflection to the east varying from 2° 10' on the west side of the map to 2° 55' on the east side. Any square is identified by the number appearing along its outer border. For example: Roy will be found in the southeast quarter of square 92-194 and Collins L. in the southeast quarter of square 100-180.

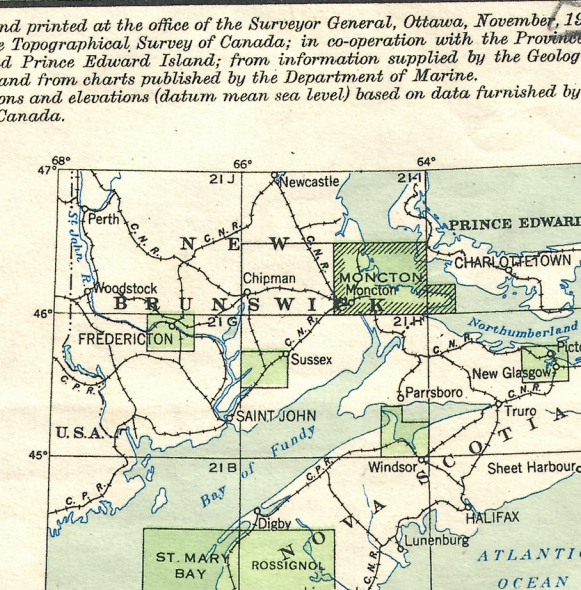
The declination of the compass needle at any place along a red line is the declination given on that red line. At other places the declination is between those given on the neighbouring red lines than at the place marked A, because it is halfway between the two red lines marked N. 24° 00' W. and N. 24° 30' W., the declination of the compass needle is N. 24° 15' W. The declination of the compass needle is increasing 2 minutes annually.
