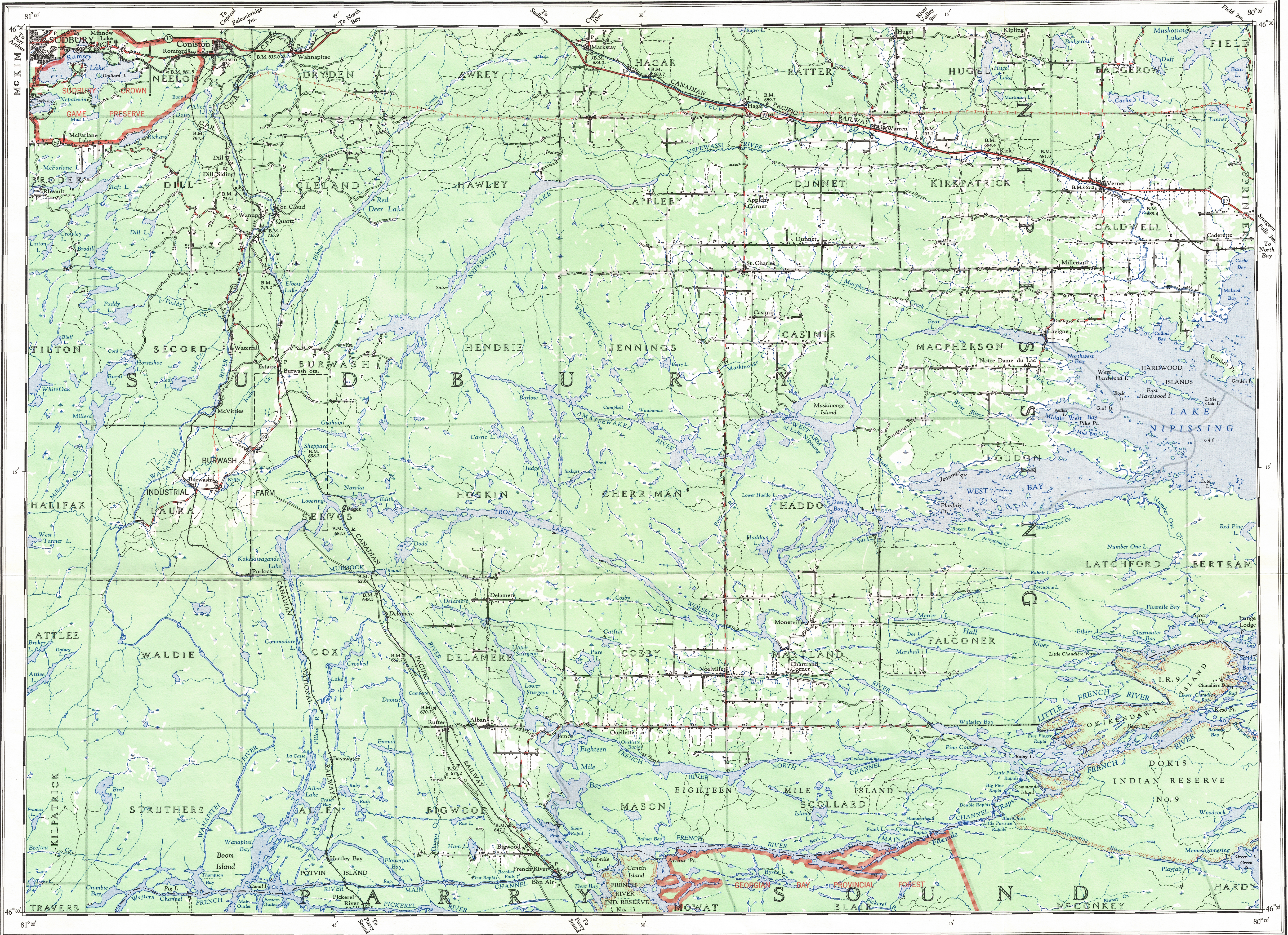
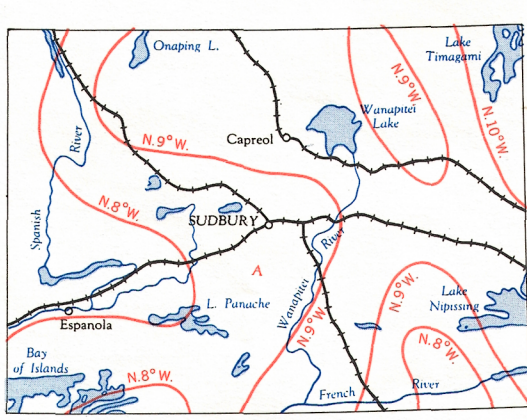


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THE DECLINATION OF THE COMPASS NEEDLE, 1948



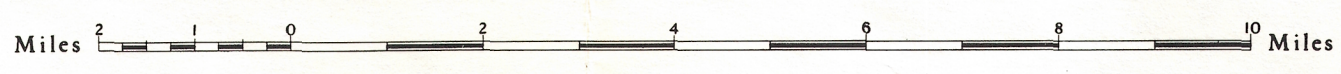
The declination of the compass needle at any place along a dotted line is the declination given on that dotted line. At other places the declination is between those given on the neighbouring dotted lines; thus at the place marked A, the declination is between N. 1° W. and 0° W. The current declinations of the compass needle are decreasing 6 minutes annually.

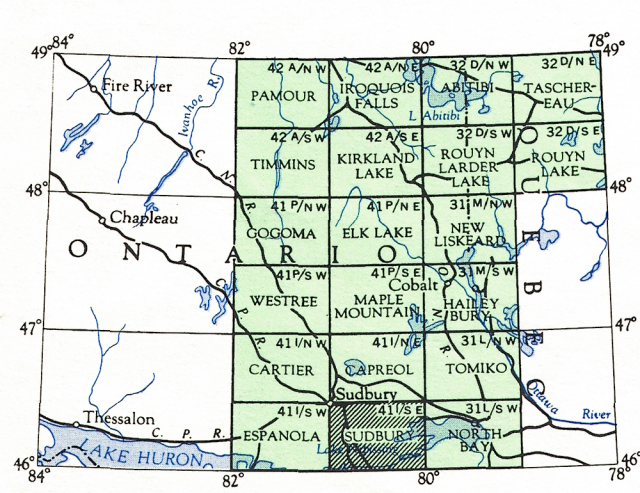
