the origin of the name of this place.

Until the Midland Railway was built, between
Truro and Windsor, this place formed a part of what is
now known as Stanley, which is four miles west of here
on the line of Railway.

When the Railway was completed and a station
built here, there also being one at Stanley four miles
west of here, it became necessary to give this place a
name, and as my house had always been a regular stopping
place for the officials of the Railway during its
construction, the General Manager decided to name the
place after myself and my husband.
