My dear Sir

I receivid a notice

From the Post master sent by you to him wishing information about change of names of rivers or places or Lakes he said did not know of any change in vicinity of Scotch Village he sent it to me not the postmaster of Mosherville I dont know of any change for some years around here — a small river running from Center Rawdon course not far from the English Church down through Greenfield School section via Walkerville and through Mosherville and emptys into Kennetcook river one mile above Mosherville Post office ~~and~~ called Little River which no doubt is marked on Hants County Map and the west line is bounded on a large Brook called Macumber brook one mile below Mosherville Post Office empty into Kennetcook River the road leading to Center Rawdon direct from post office south boundary of Mosherville about two miles to Township line on Center Rawdon Road and East to Township line between Newport and Douglas one and $\frac{3}{4}$ quarters of a mile is the East line from Mosherville post office of Mosherville and from this Township line is now called Stanley to Clarkville 5 miles East of Township Line to Birch Brook or Clarkville on Midland Railway at Kennetcook river a post office established here since Midland built — no other station or post office from Clarkville to the mouth of Gore road a post office to accomodate the Gore the railway being on the north side of Kennetcook river until it reaches Kennetcook corner on Noel road there a post office and station of Midland Railway this is about Eight miles East of Clarkville — No doubt you will hear from Burlington this place formerly called Lower Kennetcook is now called Center Burlington six miles west of Scotch Village and no doubt you wrote to and have the desired information I will not attempt to say anything about the Burlington as I am at least Nine miles from Center Burlington

Dear Sir

I received your letter

of the 14th, but I being away from home when it came I hope you will excuse the delay in not replying before I don't just understand just what you want whether it is a history of Canada or a new Geography you are getting up but as I have nothing to do to day I will give you some History of the place in 1760 my Grandfather Joseph Mosher's Father with several others in May landed at what is called now Simpsons Creek near ~~Hall~~ a mile up from the road now leading up by Mosherville on to Shubenacadie at the mouth of Shubenacadie River the first road laid out through Hants County and another vessel arrived and landed a short distance above on the left bank of the Avon River which is now called Falmouth — and in the first vessel was my Grandfathers Father James Mosher and I think were his wife and four children out of the two vessels 70 men agreed to take up twelve miles square and done so but as was the custom then times to throw in a chain occasionally and the distance is all of 13½ mile this extra chain was to make up for rough ground where the chain dropped into holes and took up chain in this square were many rivers and marsh land so the 12 mile square of upland divided into 70 parts the marsh lands the same each lot numbered and the lands marked and put together No one of upland put with No one of marsh land put on strips of paper ^{put in a hat} and I am told each man put his hand in hat and drew out a number that No was his there was some changes the proprietors knowing where the lands were by mutual consent changed so all passed off but soon many changes John Mosher and Bazillai Mosher two of James Mosher's children got the lands at and near where they landed Allen Mosher got lands in Kempt and lived there and died there the other child said to come which I doubt its coming as one daughter never left Rhode Island and married and died there the Eldest child or daughter the first female child born in the Township of Newport was born a few rods above the mill built by James Mosher on the Herbert or Bear river so called James lived there while building this mill for the 70 Proprietors —

This place where they landed they called Newport Landing and the
 12 mile square was called the Township of Newport and the land
 above was called the Township of Douglas to the Shubenacadie
 River Many years after the name Shubenacadie at the mouth of
 was changed to Maitland and a place 20 miles up the river at the
 time Intercolonial R R built was called Shubenacadie a station
 there and the farm bounding East on Township line over a mile square
 belonged to the said James Mosher when he came in possession I never
 learnt but he willed to his son Nicholas and Joseph Mosher my Grand
 Father he James died I dont know date or when they came in posse-
 sion but James built a mill on the river running down through
 the farm and called Little River Emptying into the Kennebecook
 River about the center of farm source Center Rawdon from spring
 The sons Nicholas & Joseph lived on this farm untill Joseph got tired and con-
 ceded the farm was too sm all for two large families they had not cleared much
 on this own place and their mind did not run on Farming was mechanically
 inclined so foolishly I say Jos went over 20 miles up the river took up land
 not a foot cleared on it movea up there his wife not very healthy soon returned
 as you will see by the Mosher book I send you and after my Grandmother
 died he broke up housekeeping the children soon got scattered and he Jos
 done a very foolish thing Nicholas took a job of building a Bridge over the
 Cornwallis river ^{in Kings County Nova Scotia} and warranted it to stand for one year there came an
 uncommon high freshet the next spring undiminished pier out went Bridge
 so he had to rebuild in order to do so mortgaged the whole farm
 The partys who held the mortgage soon found out another owner in
 farm came and wished N to get a quick claim deed from Joseph he N
 had lost his wife and the Bridge took to drinking and gave Joseph
 no peace untill he gave the quick claim deed it done N no good and
 the Half of the Farm was worth more than the mortgage but Joseph
 foolishly signed and lost his right in Farm doing his brother hurt
 as the half was more than the debt which the partys would have not
 lost my Grandfather would have let him live as long as he did live
 but the 16 Partys as soon as got the deed foreclosed and I never got a
 cent. My Father after he was out of his time with his Cousin they went
 down on School property Leased it for a few years built House and shop
 and lease near out John went to Toronto in 1829 in 1830 my Father came
 here bought an acre of Land built a shop and House on an acre of Land
 bought of Daniel Hines and lived and died here after a time James his brother

Viz my Father's brother bought the Daniel Wier Farm here and moved
 on it my Father having a Shop here his sons worked in the shop until we
 got able to work at ship work turned our attention to ship works we all
 settled around near by and three of James's sons settled here also two
 being sailor men one on the Farm of his Father James I am going a
 long way around to tell you how the place came to be called Mosherville
 My Father being appointed Postmaster over 50 Years ago at Woodgate
 the Party's naming him or recommending him as postmaster did not
 give Woodgate any name for the Office he asked where it Located he
 said the office at the head of Kennetcook or within 4 miles of head
 and the office at or near the mouth of river on North side of River
 is Called Lower Kennetcook we he said will call this Middle
 Kennetcook at that time only a few offices had a stamp to name office
 so as you are aware people Careless when a letter directed would just
 say Kennetcook when directed to me should say Middle Kennetcook
 and go to Lower Kennetcook sometimes go to Upper Kennetcook so people
 was terrible annoyed in not getting letters when they should as mails
 did not run only once and twice each week on those routes and circular
 for instance the mail go up by here to Gore and down through Rawdon
 would be a long time getting around here again which was annoying
 our Mail being made up at Newport this being the stamp office naming the
 name of Office on South side of Kennetcook river on the mail road travel
 the Newport Office being south of Herbet river sometimes called River above
 where James Mosher built the mill for the 70 proprietors but as I said we
 all around this place got disgusted and so annoyed at the way our letters
 got astray not being fully addressed we grumbled and talked about how
 it could be remedied I think I was the first to propose a new name
 as was not a chartered name given by the Postmaster General of
 Nova-Scotia party's all fell in with my proposal so a meeting was
 called and one of Daniel Lockhart's sons was chosen Chairman
 name changed to Lockhart son of the above Daniel who bought
 the old Joseph Mosher Farm well we looked at one and
 another no name coming for a new name presently one of the party
 jumped up and said he had been much annoyed by his
 letters getting astray and William Mosher he thought had
 struck a good way of remedying the Evil he had better name
 a man who appeared to be satisfied at the request they set
 met to name a name I said I did not care what the name
 was

I said if I named a name it would like a selfish name well I said as my Father was one of the first Mosher moved here since Nicholas and Joseph Mosher left and James Mosher their Father had built a Mill not a half mile from where we stood I would do them the Honour of Calling the place and Office Mosherville (the bounds as I wrote you before being agreed to before) I did not hear a murmur against the Chairman said will I move the name proposed by Mr Mosher several called out Yes so he put the name and not a voice against it all appeared to be satisfied and wished to remedy the Evil of Letters being so long on road this was perhaps 36 years ago and may be more I can't remember I found an old Envelope among my old papers stamped January 6th 1875 is the nearest we can find proof of date of Meeting ^{which was sometime previous to getting stamp} so the Minutes of the meeting signed by the Chairman and Secretary and several others was sent to the Legislature it was then in session at Halifax they granted the request and sometime after this meeting stamps was given to all post offices Upper Kennebunk still hold the name of Office given long ago now after a long round about way have shewn how this post office got its name I did not give it to you in my first letter as it looked selfish now you have the whole story as near as I can give my learning is limited I of course can make fairly good letters but as I said learning limited so you will please excuse my long Epistle to answer your short request this Kennebunk river we live near by Empty into the Avon river or Minas Basin the source comes out of a Bog near where my Grandfather moved to the East end of Bog is the source of five mile River running East and emptying into the Shubenacadie River Five mile up from its mouth gives it its name I will now tell you how I came to get up the Book I send you a gang of black legs one from N.S. got up a Mosher Fortune in England they being half Mosher got up this bogus Fortune many years ago notified the Mosher in N.S. of this great Fortune of Thirty two million pounds Sterling which was looked after by them and if we proved our selves to be the offspring of Hugh Mosher who came out to Rhode Island ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~in~~ ⁱⁿ prove our Heir ship and Contributed to the expense of getting but if not we would be shut off well a meeting was called and money made up and Nicholas Mosher was sent to New York to search records and see if we were the offspring of Hugh Mosher that proved satisfactory and they made it appear they had Allen a Lawyer half Mosher and ready to sail and gave him no time to think after searching records in ~~and~~ 50 pounds left beside what wanted to bring him home ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~he~~ ^{he} came home

well we did not hear any more for some time then the word came Allen
 had skipped with the money did not go to England and those black legs
 was crying out vengeance against Allen so it went on for Years next we
 heard they had found the will of Ezekiel Mosher and it was all right
 he was the Father of Hugh and Allen had not been in England and
 the money was willed to Hugh and we were his Heirs and no trouble come
 on They was getting papers fixed up and again asking us to contribute
 to the scheme some of our folks crazy in the matter a meeting called again
 it was decided if we paid any more money to send a Delegate to England
 the delegation carried and Nicholas Mosher was sent to England to
 meet their delegate and it was found Stephen Mosher of Manchester
 was the Father of our Hugh who died in Rhode Island who never left Man-
 chester and Ezekiel was a fictitious name and not the Father of our Hugh
 also found the three Moschers that came out to Boston direct did not
 come direct to Rhode Island as those black legs tried to make it appear
 well I being secretary of our meetings got this information concluded
 to get up this Mosher History I went to considerable trouble and expense
 and paid 66 dollars for printing 350 books and I did not sell near
 enough to pay the 66 lost my time and expences gathering material
 I could get 1000 printed for about 4 dollars more but I knew I could
 not sell them but I am not sorry I done so as it comes in handy
 and I find where we came from — The John Anthony who took
 up the Farm bounding on Township line west came out in the
 same ship and landing at Simpsons Creek is not one of the 70
 proprietors who took up the 12 mile square but is my great Grand
 Father the Anthonys are German decent and came from near where
 Mosher's came from as I have nothing to do to day I supply this
 Epistle I don't know what you ask about who Mosherville was named
 for whether you are getting up a History of the Dominion or not
 but if I thought it would be out within a year I would ask for one
 I never had or saw a late History only the small history got up for
 school purposes and that is not much good to me however I
 dont expect to live much longer being near 82 Years old now
 not worth while for me to bother about History As I will not
 be here long I hope you will read this all and get what you can

If this is any benefit to you worth the reading please let me know
I have a son in Montreal the only Child we have is on the
staff of Gazette printing Office he has better learning than I
if you want any thing Extra from Nova-Scotia he will give
you if in his power his address is 34 St Louis Square or
Gazette office Montreal P.Due —

I am tired of writing well close
